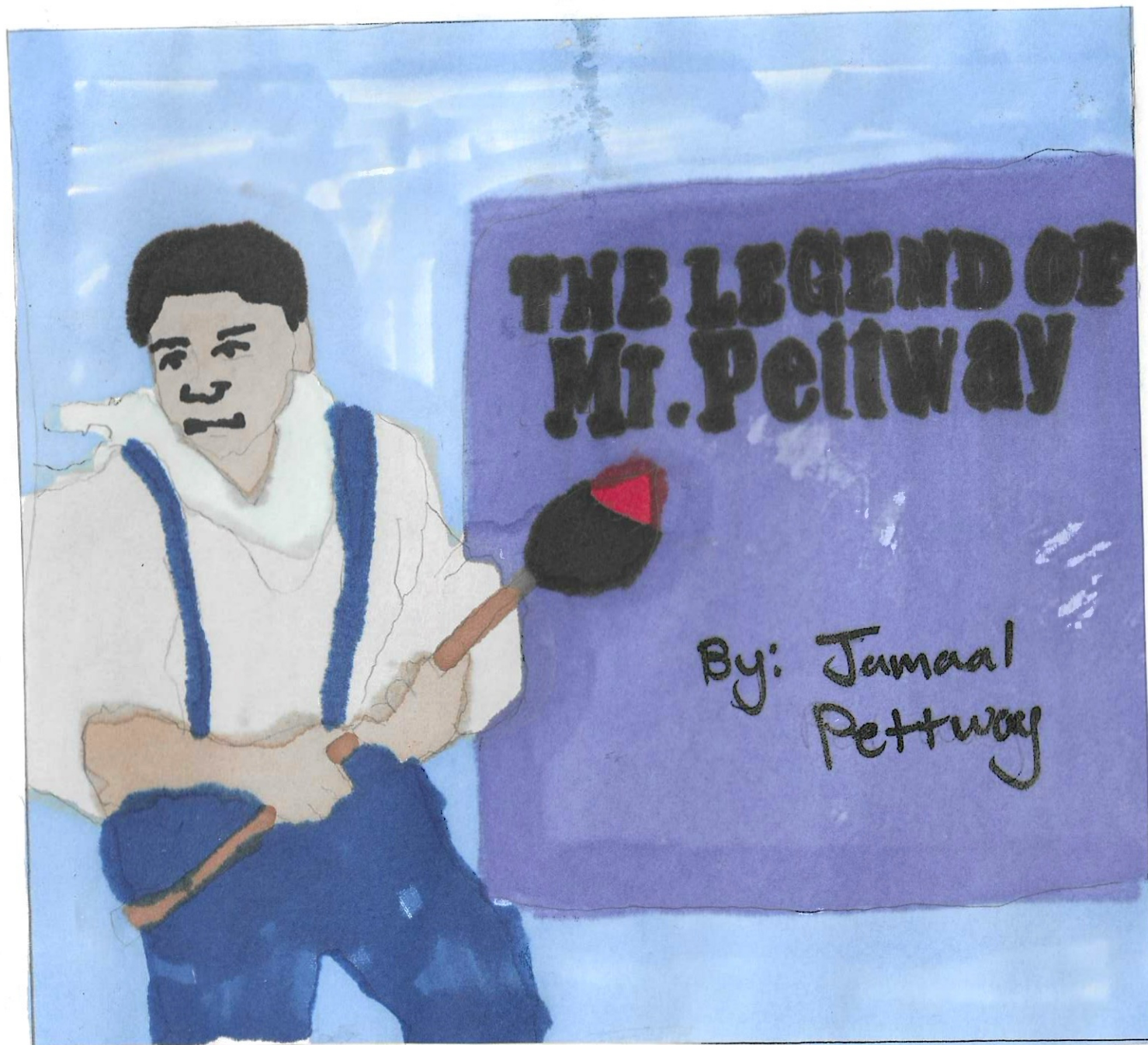






Mr. Pettway grew up loving art! He liked to make all kinds of art, but painting was his favorite. He carried his trusty paintbrush everywhere he went.



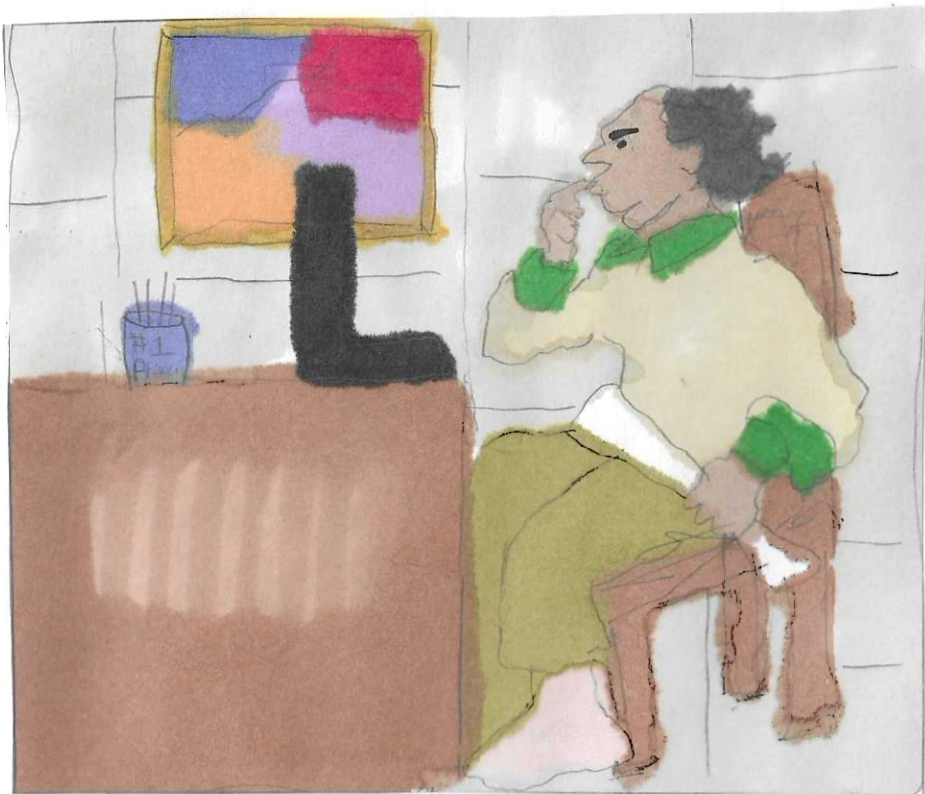
When he got older, he decided to become an art teacher. He graduated from Georgia State University to pursue his dreams!



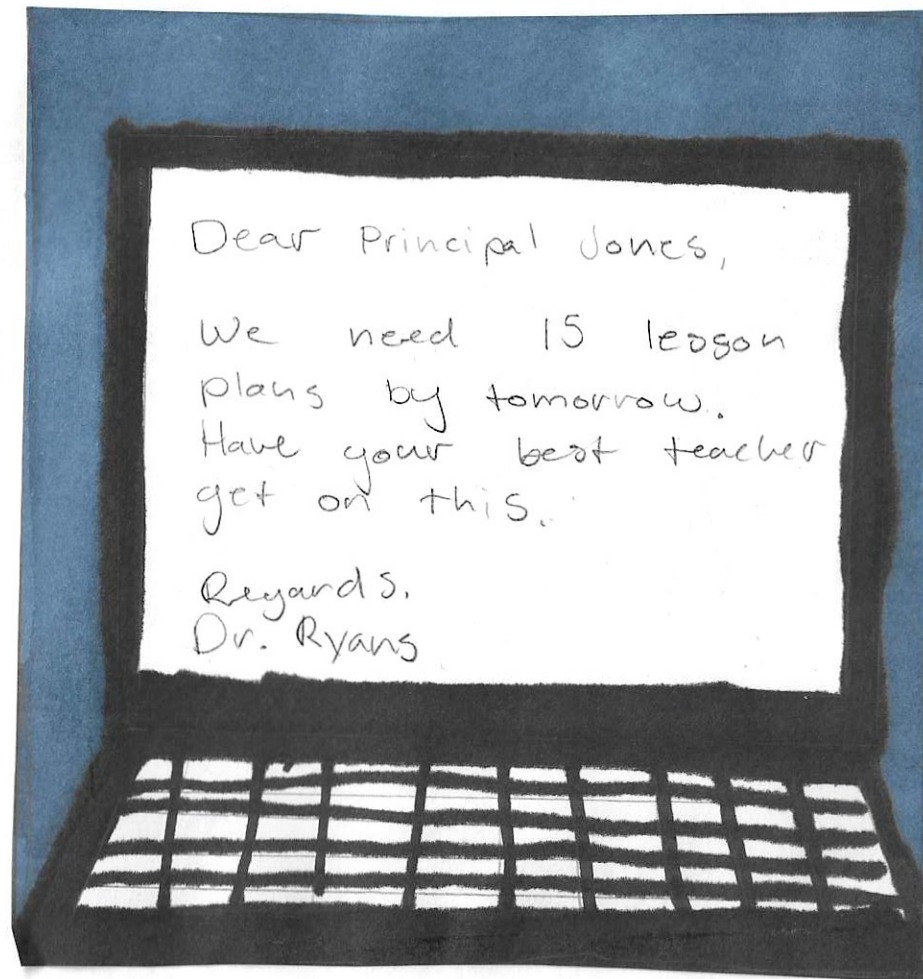
Becoming an art teacher was the best thing that could happen to him. He was able to work with young artists directly and help them find their voice.

Principal Jones could only think of one person to take on the task: Mr. Pettway. His years of experience, sample work, and his connection with his students would allow him to complete such a tall task.

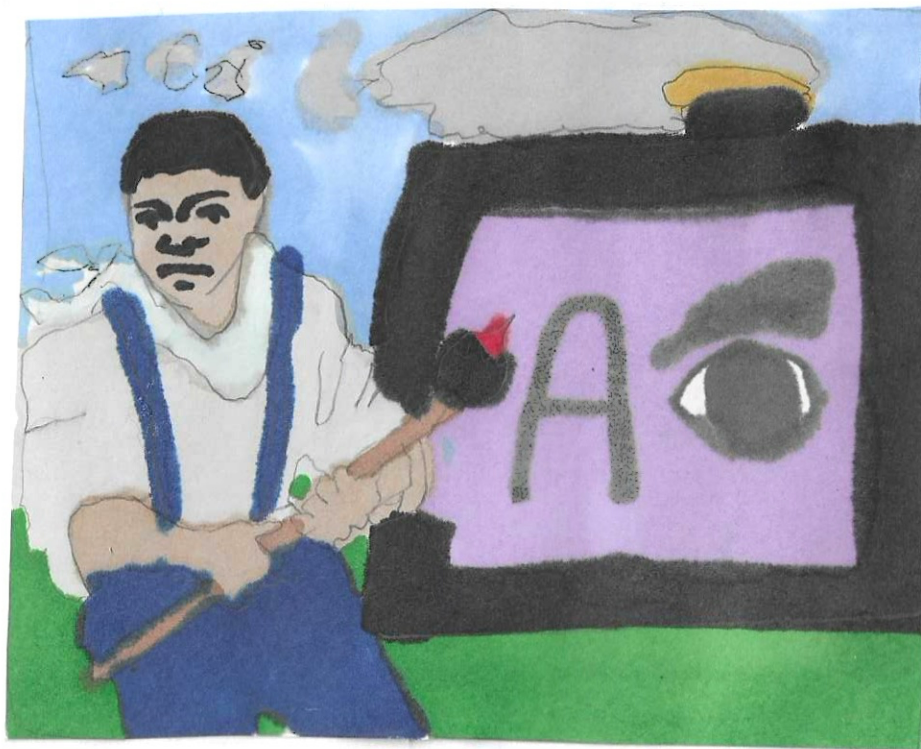
